




## Pregnancy tests date back to 1350 B.C.E.



According to a document written on ancient papyrus, Egyptian women urinated on wheat and barley seeds to determine if they were pregnant or not, reports the Office of History in the National Institutes of Health. If wheat grew, it predicted a female baby. If barley grew, it predicted a male baby. The woman was not pregnant if nothing grew. Experimenting with this seed theory in 1963 proved it was accurate 70 percent of the time.

## การทุดสอบการตั้งครรภ์มีมาตั้งแต่ 1,350 ปีก่อนคริสตกาล









## Pregnancy (n.) = การตั้งครรถ์

Meaning: the state of being pregnant

Example: Most women feel sick in the mornings during their first months of pregnancy. หญิงตั้งครรภ์ส่วนใหญ่จะมีอาการแพ้ท้องในตอนเช้า





#### Angient (adj.) = โบราณ

Meaning: of or from a long time ago, having lasted for a very long time

Example: the ancient kingdoms of Mexico อาณาจักรโบราณแห่งเม็กซิโก



#### Urinate (v.) = ปัสสาวะ

Meaning: to pass urine from the body

Example: After six months, she was vomiting and <u>urinating</u> blood daily หกเดือนผ่านมา เธออาเจียนและปัสสาวะเป็นเลือลทุกวัน







## Wheat (n.) = ข้าวสาสี

Meaning: a plant whose yellowish-brown grain is used for making flour, or the grain itself **Example**: We drove past fields of ripening wheat. เราบับรถผ่านทุ่งข้าวสาลีสุก



### Predict (v.) =ทำนาย, บอกส่วงหน้า, พยากรณ์

Meaning: to say that an event or action will happen in the future, especially as a result of knowledge or experience

**Example:** It's still not possible to accurately <u>predict</u> the occurrence of earthquakes.





#### Accurate (adj.) = 11211

Meaning: correct, exact, and without any mistakes Example: We hope to become more <u>accurate</u> in predicting earthquakes.
